

Her just released film, Happy New Year, is rocking at the box-office and Deepika Padukone is on cloud nine. With back-to-back hits and some of the best projects in her kitty, Deepika currently commands the numero uno position in Bollywood. However the actress is modest about her achievements and is not carried away by all the adulation. In a candid chat, Deepika talks about her journey in Bollywood and how she has evolved as an actress over the years.



I am delighted. It shows that our hard work has paid off. Anyway, we were all confident about the outcome of the film. It was destined to sweep the box-office.

How was the experience of teaming up with Farah Khan once again after Om Shanti Om?

It was a home-coming of sorts for me, with the love and affection I got on the sets from Farah and Shah Rukh. It also brought back memories of *Om Shanti Om*, when I began my career in films. Even today Farah calls me baby and I call her Maa. That's the kind of relation we share with each other. Apart from that, I consider Red Chillies Entertainment as my home banner. For me they are more like a family. I wouldn't bat an eyelid to work with them.

Did you give an immediate nod when Farah Khan approached you for the role in the film?

After the release of Chennai Express, Farah called me to be a part of this film. I had no clue about the script of the film but I immediately agreed at that moment. There

were no two ways about it. I can never forget the fact that it was Farah and Shah Rukh who were instrumental in giving me the most beautiful launch in my career. I feel indebted to them.

What was the best part of playing the role of Mohini Joshi in Happy New Year?


The most enjoyable part of the role was the dancing bit. Like Mohini who is obsessed about dancing, I too love dance. The character brought my dancing skills to the fore and I thoroughly enjoyed the experience.

How do you look back on your journey in films and your meteoric rise to success?

It has been a very wholesome journey. I had a fantastic debut and few newcomers are lucky to get such a promising launch. However the going was not always smooth. I have had my own share of ups and downs. There was a time when some of my films flopped miserably at the box-office. I went through one of the lowest phases in my career at that point but I did not lose heart. I used the opportunity to analyse my strengths and weaknesses. That was the learning phase for me. With four back-to-back hits to her credit, the year 2013 has been a rocking one for Deepika Padukone. The actress, who has beaten all her contemporaries in the race to become the number one actress in Bollywood, is currently on the wish-list of every big filmmaker in B-town.

The early years

Hailing from a sports family, Deepika has seen success from close quarters when her father, Prakash Padukone, won several medals as the ace badminton player of the country. Born in Copenhagen and raised in Bangalore, Deepika was educated at Bangalore's Sophia High School, and completed her pre-university education at Mount Carmel College. She began her career as a teenage badminton player in national level championships. She also played baseball in a few state level tournaments.

Her foray into modeling

While she had a great affinity for sports, Deepika was introduced to the world of modeling from a very early age. She worked as a child model, appearing in a couple of ad campaigns at the age of eight. As she grew up, she began to take a keen interest in modeling, even as she enrolled at the Indira Gandhi National Open University for a Bachelor of Arts in sociology. However, she later dropped out of college in order to become a full-fledged model. Deepika's first major stint was the Liril TV commercial, which got her recognition. Later she made a debut in the Lakme Fashion Week for designer Suneet Varma, and won the 'Model of the Year' at the Kingfisher Fashion Awards.



Debut in films

Deepika decided to relocate to Mumbai at the age of 21, in order to pursue her modeling career. At this juncture, she accepted an offer to feature in a music video for Himesh Reshammiya's song Naam Hai Tera. Soon after choreographer turned director Farah Khan spotted her in the video and decided to sign her opposite Shah Rukh Khan for her film, Happy New Year. However, the film was indefinitely delayed. In 2006, Deepika made her film debut with a Kannada film Aishwarya, where she played the role of an assertive and fun-loving girl. The romantic comedy proved to be a major commercial success.

Her big Bollywood launch

By the end of 2006, Farah Khan decided to shelve Happy New Year and confirmed Deepika for the reincarnation melodrama Om Shanti Om (2007). Deepika, who played a double role in the film opposite the King Khan, managed to pull off both the roles with panache. Om Shanti Om went on to become a box office hit and Deepika was an overnight sensation. Her tall lithe frame, the dimpled smile and twinkling eyes took Bollywood by

The subsequent highs and lows

Her next two films Bachna Ae Haseeno (2008) and Chandni Chowk To China (2009) were major disasters. She was almost written off, when Imtiaz Ali's Love Aaj Kal (2009) opposite Saif Ali Khan, proved to be one of the biggest hits of 2009. But Deepika's journey was not a smooth one. In 2010, Deepika had five releases namely Karthik Calling Karthik, Housefull, Lafangey Parindey, Break Ke Baad and Khelein Hum Jee Jaan Se, all of which proved to be box-office duds, with the sole exception of Housefull. In 2011, Deepika made a special appearance in a raunchy title track for Rohan Sippy's Dum Maaro Dum, which made headlines. That was followed by another disastrous film, Aarakshan (2011), which failed to click despite the star presence of Amitabh Bachchan, Saif Ali Khan and Manoj Bajpai. Then came the comedy-drama Desi Boyz, but the role failed to make any impact on her career.

Her career defining film and return to success

The turning point in Deepika's career came with Homi Adjania's Cocktail (2012) where she was part of a love triangle with Saif Ali Khan and Diana Penty. The film earned her commercial and critical acclaim. Her father Prakash Padukone was so impressed by her performance in the film that he gifted her one of the awards he had won in badminton.

That was followed by a slew of hits in 2013 that began with Race 2 opposite Saif Ali



Khan followed by Yeh Jawaani Hai Deewani opposite Ranbir Kapoor, Chennai Express with Shah Rukh Khan and Goliyon Ki Raasleela Ram-Leela opposite Ranveer Singh. The actress made a grand entry in the 100 crore club even as filmmakers began to look at her for her newfound potential. Today, trade experts believe that she is a safe bet at the ticket windows.

The actress is now looking forward to 2014 with a promising line-up of films starting with Homi Adajania's Finding Fanny Fernandes, Farah Khan's Happy New Year and a Tamil film Kochadaiyaan opposite none other than the South superstar Rajnikant.

Love Life

It was during the filming of Bachna Ae Haseeno in 2008 that Deepika and Ranbir Kapoor came close to each other. The two were open about their relationship and Deepika even got Ranbir's initials tattooed on the nape of her neck. However two years later the couple parted ways. The actress commented in an interview that she was angry and felt 'betrayed". Later Deepika was rumoured to have moved on with Siddharth Mallya, the scion of Kingfisher. She also went on to become the brand ambassador of Kingfisher Bangalore IPL team. However she denied the relationship.

Deepika and Ranbir were back in the news once again when she signed Yeh Jawani Hai Deewani with him, but she put to rest all rumours by stating that they were nothing more than good friends. Recently, she was reportedly dating her Ram-Leela co-star Ranveer Singh. The two were spotted partying in Dubai. It was reported that Ranveer went all the way to meet the actress when she was shooting for Chennai Express.

Philanthropic work

Deepika participated in the World 10K Bangalore marathon, which raised INR13.1 million in support of 81 NGOs. She also adopted the Maharashtra village of Ambegaon as part of NDTV's Greenathon Campaign, to provide the village with a regular supply of electricity. Deepika has been involved with the Olympic Gold Quest team, established by her father and billiards player Geet Sethi, besides several other sports players, to support Indian athletes at the Olympic Games. Among Deepika's other initiatives is the line of clothing for women that she launched in association with the retail chain Van Heusen.

Endorsements

The actress has been endorsing several brands and is said to be the highest paid actress in the endorsement deal circuit. There have been reports that her deal with Garnier is worth 60 million, a record breaking remuneration for any Indian actress. The actress reveals that she should be able to connect with a particular brand before endorsing it. She also has brands like Nescafe, Tissot, and Sony Cyber Shot, Wrigleys Orbit, Maybelline and Pepsi to her name

She may not be the best known actress in town but Neha **Dhupia certainly has** a figure that is the envy of her Bollywood counterparts. The actress reveals her fitness secrets and why fitness is an important part of her life.

Former Miss India turned actress, Neha Dhupia who is looking forward to her forthcoming film, *Ungli* asserts that fitness is a way of life for her. Neha admits that she realized the importance of fitness after her amazing transformation from the fat-to-fit phase when she was in her early teens. The actress recalls, "It is a well-known fact that I was a very fat kid. It took me a long time to cut down on all the flab but I have never looked back ever since."

According to Neha, everyone has fat days and thin days but that should not affect the fitness levels at the end of the day. She also feels that it is up to each individual to maintain his or her level of fitness, depending on various factors. "It is important for each of us to understand our body and accordingly tune in to fitness. A

healthy body also reflects on your state of mind and well-being. It keeps you balanced at all levels," she avers.

While she is firm about her fitness regime, Neha does not subscribe to the size zero craze, "I am not in favour of the size zero fad but I do feel it's important for me as an actress to have all the curves in the right places," she maintains.

Neha's exercise regime

Neha's daily exercise routine starts in the morning with a few minutes of stretching followed by cardio and weight training. While most actors favour rigorous workouts to get into shape, Neha believes in balancing her exercise regime with the concept of holistic healing. "I am an ardent follower of yoga and Pilates and make it a point to

include them in my everyday regime. While yoga teaches you to breathe correctly and increases the flexibility of your body, Pilates helps in providing the necessary balance. I also believe in exercising outdoors as the fresh air makes a lot of difference," she elucidates.

The actress advises that everyone should inculcate the habit of playing at least one sport to remain fit, "That way you enjoy the sport and also maintain your fitness levels," she says, adding that she enjoys the outdoor sports of tennis and squash. "I play tennis or squash for at least an hour every day. At other times, I go for a long swim. My other favourite exercise is Zumba, a dance exercise which really rejuvenates you."

Her diet regime

Neha believes in the concept of healthy eating, which means home-cooked food with little oil and eating small meals throughout the day. Among the strict no-no's in her diet are canned foods, aerated drinks, pickles and jams. She also adheres to a diet of organic food.

Her day begins with a glass of warm water with honey and lemon. That is followed by a breakfast of fruits. Midday meal consists of four boiled eggs with two pieces of brown bread. Lunch is the biggest meal of the day and it includes chapattis, dal, vegetables and sprouts. In the evening, she has a cup of green tea, followed by a bowl of dry fruits. The actress wraps up the day with an early and light dinner, "Dinner is restricted to grilled vegetables, salad or fish. I make it a point to restrict my carbohydrate intake at night," she reveals.

The actress adds that it is important to drink plenty of water and fluids to detoxify the body and keep the skin glowing, "I drink plenty of fluids in the form of coconut water, juice or plain water. It flushes my body and keeps me full," she says.

Above all, the actress reveals that the best way to rejuvenate your body and mind is to take a break and go out on a holiday, "I make it a point to take a break from my work and exercise once in six months to refresh myself. I switch off my cell phones and go off on a long holiday where I have my me time. It refreshes my mind so that I can concentrate on my work with a new approach when I come back. I think we all need those moments when we can spend times with ourselves in order to recharge our energies and make the best of our lives," she quips.

I am at an interesting juncture of life today. I have three promising films in the offing. While Kill Dil is on the verge of release, Dil Dhadakne Do is nearing completion and I am all geared up for my role in Bajirao Mastani. After the success of Ram Leela I was flooded with interesting offers but I did not go on a signing spree. I decided to opt for only a few select projects. Likewise when my Durex commercial became a hit, I was wooed by some of the best brands in the advertising industry but I decided not to sign all of them. It's my aim to pursue creative avenues. I want to be someone like Woody Allen.

Your bustling energy levels and your over-enthusiasm have always been the subject of conversation. What keeps you going?

I believe I have one life and it is important to make the best of it. When I broke my back during a schedule of Lootera, I realized that life was far too short to brood on trivial problems. Later when I was down with dengue, I had to literally fight to stay alive. More recently, I lost my childhood friend, who was a month younger to me. We had planned our lives together with our families and kids but destiny had other things in store for him. I understand the fragility of life now, which is why I try to give my best to everything I do. My optimism is all about being alive and living every minute to the best.

are given to you, you are called ebullient, impatient, aggressive and also a sex symbol?

I am not very fond of all the tags whether they are good or bad. I am not happy with the negative ones either. I am not always enthusiastic as I am made out to be. There is a frustration that comes along with it. I feel they are all shortcomings of my own personality. I try to keep things light when dealing with people. I guess that is misconstrued as being over-enthusiastic and loud.

Recently you were in the news for signing a condom campaign. Where do you draw the line when it comes to choosing endorsements?

I agree I endorsed a condom advertisement because I want people to be responsible. I felt it was an ideal way to contribute to AIDS awareness in society. I am choosing a whole range of ads all with a purpose and firm belief in the products. I don't take up commercials that convey a wrong message.

Apart from that, it is debatable as to what is ethically right or wrong. What is good for one person may be perceived as wrong by another person. As far as alcohol products are concerned, it's a personal choice. I do feel that anyone who drinks or believes in drinking should do so responsibly. If there is Maruti and Royal Stag, there is Durex too. Even in the Chings ad, I wanted children to enjoy the noodles and not be bored of it.



You seem to share a great equation with all your directors. What about director Shaad Ali who has directed your upcoming release, Kill Dil?

Shaad is more like a big brother to me. I have known him since the age of 16. I had always dreamt that I would become an actor one day and Shaad would direct the film. We are ten years apart but we bond over everything. He is extremely passionate about his work. He is energetic and has a great music sense just like Sanjay Leela Bhansali. I even assisted him for one and half years when we did commercials together. When my initial efforts to get into acting proved inconclusive, it was Shaad who persuaded me not to give up. He got me into Makrand Deshpande's theatre group. It was at his instance that I refused several offers before I got my first big break with Yash Raj Films.

How was the experience of sharing screen space with veteran actor Govinda in Kill Dil?

I am a huge fan of Govinda. He is the Jim Carrey of India. Working with him was a dream-come-true for me. He was touched when I told him that I danced on his sonas in my childhood days. I feel that Govinda is the most under-rated actor in the industry. In Kill Dil, he plays an out and out villain for the first time; this side to him has never been explored on screen before. Not many are aware that his mother is a singer and Govinda has inherited her talent. I was astonished when I heard him singing when Shaad played the guitar on the sets. There's one particular sequence of eight minutes in the film where he had to admonish me. He had visualized the entire scene in his mind and he completed it with utmost precision in one take.

What was the experience like working with Parineeti Chopra?

Parineeti was a wide-eyed innocent girl when she entered films. She has now become a seasoned performer. She was born to be a heroine. She has an endearing personality too.

You have been teamed up with Anushka Sharma in your under-production film, Dil Dhadakne Do. How was the experience

teaming up with Anushka once again, after working with her in your first two films?

It was after three years that we got together once again in Kill Dil. Anushka is one of my favourite actresses. It was she who introduced me to the nitty gritty of facing the camera when I made my Hindi film debut. I was an assistant director prior to that and never quite conversant with acting. I was not well-versed with camera angles but Anushka taught me all the basics of acting in films. She is so natural in front of the camera that you never get the impression that she is acting. She has definitely grown as an actor.

You were seen romancing Priyanka Chopra in Gunday. Now you are playing her brother in your forthcoming film, Dil Dhadakne Do and her husband in your next film, Bajirao Mastani. How difficult was the changing chemistry in these films?

I keep getting confused in my head every time I face the camera with Priyanka. It feels kind of weird now. I don't know how the audience will accept three different relationships between us in such a short span of time. But we are not exceptions. Shah Rukh Khan and Aishwarya Rai played brother and sister in Josh and went on to play lovers in Devdas. So it's a testament that the audience is mature enough to accept contrasting relationships on screen. We have done our parts convincingly.

What about your equation with Deepika? What do you like most about her and are you dating her?

I would like to state on record that I am very much single. However I have a great admiration for Deepika. She is a brilliant actor and a very warm and affectionate person. I was the first one to tweet about her qualities and achievements but I wouldn't like to talk about it now. I think people started taking notice of her talent and potential after her performance in Cocktail, though I liked her best in Lafangey Parindey. She was also outstanding in Chennai Express, Yeh Jawani Hai Deewani and Ram Leela. One of her best qualities is her hard-working nature. Despite doing double shifts for almost a year she was very well- organized. I have a tough time when it comes to multi-tasking various projects.

You are said to have hiked your price after your recent spate of successes?

For the best work you do in Bollywood you don't get paid. The bigger the film and the banner, the lesser the pay. But the experience of doing such films is more rewarding than getting a hefty price for an insignificant film.

We are also told that you are fond of writing. Are you planning to pen down a script in the near future?

It's my aim to pursue creative avenues. I am currently writing and have two ideas. One of the subjects is a pop corn entertainment and the other is a social satire-a black comedy. However, I am too involved with acting right now. I will start working on these ideas sometime in the future when I am not doing too much work.

Ranveer Singh was roped in by Myntra.com to promote its jeans brand, Roadster. It also marked his debut in the advertising world.





Brela

The small fishing village of Brela, located between Omiš and Makarska, is one of the best destinations in the region for a family holiday. 




Apart from my clothes, I am fussy about:

In a free-wheeling chat, the actor discusses his journey in Bollywood so far and whether his Pakistani origin comes in the way of his Bollywood career.



You seemed to have vanished into oblivion after your last film, Total Siyappa. Apparently, you have also cut down on signing films.

I did get some good offers in the intervening period but I wanted to spend time with my family. For me, work comes second in my list of priorities; my family matters more to me. When I take up a project, I come to India, finish my shooting and return back. However, I do intend to make up for the lost time and take on more films. I am not at a stage like Aamir Khan where I can do one film a year and be satisfied.

Does your reluctance to travel to India more often have anything to do with the visa problems faced by Pakistani actors? That is definitely not the reason. Besides, visa problems depend entirely on the policy of the country granting the visa.

Tell us about your role in your forthcoming film, Kill Dil.

I play the role of a killer in the film. It is totally different from any of the roles I have played so far. I have a rugged look in the film and have also changed my dialect for the role. I also worked hard in order to get the beefed up look for the role. The audiences will be in for a surprise when they see me in this film.


How was the experience working with veteran actor Govinda and the very energetic Ranveer Singh?

I am a great fan of Govinda and have grown on films like Coolie No.1 and Hero No.1. He's a multi-talented actor. While Govinda is best known for his comic timing, Kill Dill will see him in a reversal of roles. Ranveer and I had so much respect for him that we would often sit around a bon fire and sing songs with him. Ranveer is also a great co-star to work with and we shared a great rapport during the making of the film.

Looking back, are you happy with the way your career has shaped so far?

It's my fourth year in the industry and the journey so far has been fairly satisfying. Out of the five films I have done three have been hits, which is not bad at all. Also, I have no problems about the roles that have come my

I am delighted and happy for myself and the entire unit that Bang Bang has clicked at the box-office.

My instinct told me that the film was destined to be a success after the tribulations we went through shooting for it. It was as if we were trading with the universe for our safety as we risked some of the most daredevil stunts for the film. For the audiences, the story had the ideal mix of nail-biting action sequences and romance both of which proved to be a sell-out at the box-office. For me it was a novel experience doing an edge-ofthe-seat thriller, something that I had not attempted before.

I share a good chemistry with all my heroes, not just Hrithik Roshan.

For a great on-screen chemistry to happen, the screenplay has to be well-defined too. You should also share a good tuning with the director. I remember when I did Mere Brother Ki Dulhan, I was great friends with the director and it reflected in the comfort level I showed on screen.

Shooting for Bang Bang was a formidable challenge for me, Hrithik and the entire unit:

The action in the film took its toll on us and we had to endure a lot as we progressed through the shooting of the film. A lot of health issues also arose during the shoot. In one particular sequence we were expected to jump out of machines up to 50 feet out of the water, which is also called fly-boarding. I was petrified and chickened out at the last minute but Hrithik was all game and went 50 feet up in the air with guns in his hand. He subsequently suffered a brain injury and had to be rushed to Mumbai for a brain surgery. On another occasion we battled a storm while shooting on an island in Thailand. The boat we were travelling in was about to capsize and we prepared ourselves for the worst. Many of the crew didn't know how to swim and they started crying. Fortunately we were all saved.

The first thought that came to my mind when we had a close brush with death was about the well-being of my six sisters and my mother.

I have a big family and I felt concerned for my mother and how she would be able to cope up if anything happened to me. It wasn't easy for my mother raising seven






BHAAG MILKHA BHAAG


BOMBAY TALKIES




RAANJHANAA






AASHIQUI 2




KILL DILL

On rejecting offers for the sake of Yeh Hai Mohabbatein:

I had my own reservations about how well the show would work considering that it was scheduled for a late night slot. The only promising aspect of the show was its storyline and the fact that it was the brainchild of Ekta Kapoor. If Ekta comes up with a subject, you can be rest assured that it will be out of the ordinary. Secondly, when I heard about the storyline and my character, I fell in love with it. I knew that

it would be tough for a show to get TRPs for a late night slot but I took it up as a challenge and it eventually paid off. I had to lose out on several promising offers in the bargain. I refused all of them with a heavy heart. I stuck to my professionalism and decided to stay on with the show and I guess it has worked for me excellently. On how the show has changed her outlook towards life:

I have never been a pessimist but playing the character of Ishita in Yeh Hai Mohabbatein has definitely changed my perception towards life. The serial is all about being optimistic even in the biggest of crisis. It teaches you to have faith in life come what may. In real life too, we come across difficult situations which we should learn to overcome with a positive mindset. Life is full of surprises and there is always a silver lining hidden beneath every cloud. If we talk about Ishita, she is an amazingly loving step mother, a complete contrast from the image of a step mother that most people have in their minds.

On her off-screen rapport with co-star Karan Patel:

Karan and I no doubt share a great chemistry on screen but off-screen we are poles apart in terms of our personalities, our likes and dislikes and our choices in life. Karan is a party person while I'm a family person. He talks too much and I talk very less on set. He is a prankster and I

just smile at his pranks. If there would've been any similarity between us we would have probably ended up arguing with each other but when there's nothing to talk about, getting into a fight is really out of the question. To be honest, we share a very comical equation on the set and I totally

On her favourite diversions when she is not actina:

I am an avid follower of the sport of rifle shooting and have trained in it for a long time. Whenever I go back to Bhopal, I make it a point to catch up on my shooting practice. Last year I even participated in the rifle shooting competition and won a medal. Now it has become a great diversion for me to go there, bag prizes and come back to Mumbai. I would like to join the Eklavya shooting academy in Mumbai but I doubt whether I will be able to find the time.

On the equation she shares with her fans: I hate to upset my fans in anything I do, even if it's the simplest of things. When they like my work and appreciate it, I feel rewarded. I like to get their feedback in everything I do. If I need to do something which is necessary for the character, I don't react but I do listen to their suggestions otherwise and actually work on them. It gives me pleasure to work for compliments.

I am an actress and will always remain one

Television and film actress, Shweta Prasad and arrested sent rehabilitation home following her alleged involvement in a prostitution racket, is out of her ordeal. In a conversation with Subhash K Jha, the actress who was seen in films like Makdee (child artist), Igbal and Darna Zaroori Hai, besides the television serial, Kahani Ghar Ghar Ki, makes some startling revelations about the incident and the truth behind all the rumours.

Cinema has been my life and breath from the age of ten. It is my identity and I'd never defame the industry

Shweta Basu Prasad, who was linked to a controversial prostitution racket, is back in Mumbai amidst speculative reports. The actress admits to being unfazed by the incident and reveals that she has no complaints against anyone apart from a journalist who attributed statements to her when she was going through her hour of crisis, "The statement was wrongly

attributed to me and circulated everywhere. I had no idea about it as I had no access to newspapers or websites during my two month stay at the rehabilitation centre."

It may be recalled that Shweta was quoted stating in sections of the media that she was compelled to take up prostitution to support her family when she was out of money and "all the doors were closed for her".


The actress now insists that she had never made any such statements, "I was in custody. I wasn't even allowed to speak to my mother and father so there was no way I could speak to the media. Whoever made up that statement damaged my reputation by saying that all the doors were closed on me," she avers.

Shweta informs that she and her family are now in the process of tracking down the newspaper from where the allegedly fake statements originated. "We are taking strong legal action against them. I need to set this falsification right before I move on. This statement suggests that I made a comment on other actresses and their lifestyle. Cinema has been my life and breath from the age of ten. It is my identity and I'd never defame the industry."

She is also disturbed by the way the media reports, "I've a degree in mass communications and I wonder if I did the right thing by choosing to study journalism when a section of the media is so irresponsible."

According to Shweta the reality is totally different from what it was made out to be in the media. "I hadn't been called to Hyderabad by any agent for commercial sex. I had gone there to attend an awards ceremony. I missed my return flight in the morning and I guess I made a wrong decision thereafter. Sometimes you just trust strangers in a situation. My air ticket and stay were completely done by the organizers of the awards function. There was a raid I am not denying the incident. Later, my mother was running in and out of courts with petition after petition. I wasn't even allowed to call her. The facts are definitely not what they've been made out to be."

The actress admits that the police interrogated her for names of Tollywood actresses who were possibly involved in prostitution rackets during her detention but she denies making any statement, "I didn't even know many of their names. Why should I make comments on other actresses? Shame on the people who said I was forced to do certain things by my family to afford a lifestyle."



Contrary to reports that she was treated shabbily during her two-month stay at the rehabilitation centre, Shweta reveals that she spent the period productively and faced no such problems, "I was at a rescue home- a hostel for kids who are victims of human trafficking. I volunteered as a teacher there and taught the kids Hindi, English and Hindustani classical music. I used my two months in there very productively. I was not depressed at all. While I was in there I realized how lucky I was to have a family to support me. My parents have always wanted me to pursue a dignified career."

The only setback she suffered during this period was the sad demise of her grandfather, who passed away due to the shock, "That's one loss I'll have to live with all my life. I couldn't even be at the last rituals. Thanks to the reports in the media my grandfather was under the notion that I actually made those awfully wrong statements. I will never forget myself for missing that flight back from Hyderabad to Mumbai."

Right now, Shweta has decided to start life on a fresh new note, "I am confident that I will get over this. I don't think I've the luxury of being weak. I am not going to let one incident spoil my life. I don't have time to sit at cafes taking selfies. I've dedicated my life to cinema and acting."

She further adds that the incident is unlikely

to cast aspersions on her acting career, "I've friends in the film industry. I am wellconnected. I was auditioning for roles even when the arrest happened. I've spent three years of my life making a documentary on Hindustani classical music. I turned down roles after my first Tamil film as a leading lady was a hit because I wanted to focus on my documentary," she says.

Fortunately for her, filmmakers like Hansal Mehta have offered to cast her in their forthcoming films, "I'd like to audition for Hansal Mehta and get the role only if I am suitable for it. I don't want a role out of sympathy. I don't want people to think I am cashing in on the controversy," she says.

Prior to that, she plans to return to the postproduction of her documentary on Hindustani classical music, after which she proposes to get back to acting with a vengeance, "I am an actress and I will always remain one. Life has moved forward exactly from where I left off," she quips.

Papite Ke Kofte

Preparation Time: 15 mins Cooking Time: 20 mins Makes 4 servings

INGREDIENTS

For The Koftas

- 1 1/2 cups grated raw papaya
- 1 cup boiled, peeled and mashed potatoes
- 1 tsp dried mango powder (amchur)
- 1/2 tsp turmeric powder (haldi)
- 1 tsp chilli powder
- 1 tsp garam masala
- Salt to taste
- Oil for deep-frying

FOR THE GRAVY

- 2 tbsp oil
- 2 tbsp broken cashewnuts (kaju)
- 1/2 tsp cumin seeds (jeera)
- 1 cup chopped onions
- 1/2 tsp chopped garlic (lehsun)
- 1/2 tsp chopped ginger (adrak)
- 1 slit green chilli
- 1/2 tsp coriander (dhania) powder
- 1/2 tsp chilli powder
- 1/4 tsp turmeric powder (haldi)
- 1 1/2 cups chopped tomatoes
- 1/4 tsp garam masala
- 2 tbsp fresh cream
- Salt to taste

tried making koftas with raw papaya? Try it once and it will soon become your first choice for making kofta, always. Here, grated papaya held together by mashed potatoes is made into crisp deep-fried

METHOD

For the koftas

- 1. Squeeze the grated papaya till all the water drains out. Transfer the papaya into a deep bowl, add all the remaining ingredients and mix well.
- 2. Divide the mixture into 12 equal portions and roll each portion into a ball. Keep aside.
- 3. Heat the oil in a deep kadhai and deepfry the koftas, a few at a time, till they turn golden brown in colour from all the sides.
- 4. Drain on an absorbent paper and keep aside.

For the gravy

- 1. Heat 1 tablespoon of the oil in deep pan, add the cashewnuts and sauté on a medium flame for 1 to 2 minutes.
- 2. Remove the cashewnuts, drain out the oil and blend them to a smooth paste along with approx. 1 tbsp of water. Keep aside.
- 3. Heat the remaining 1 tbsp of oil in the same pan and add the cumin seeds.
- When the seeds crackle, add the onions and sauté on a medium flame for 2
- 5. Add the garlic, ginger and green chilli and sauté on a medium flame for another minute.
- 6. Add the coriander powder, chilli powder, turmeric powder and tomatoes and cook

- on a medium flame for 2 minutes, while stirring occasionally.
- 7. Add the prepared cashewnut paste, garam masala, 3/4 cup of water, cream and salt, mix well and cook on a medium flame for 3 to 4 minutes, while stirring occasionally.
- 8. Cool slightly, discard the green chilli and blend lightly using a hand blender to a coarse mixture. Keep aside.

HOW TO PROCEED

- 1. Just before serving, re-heat the gravy, add the koftas, mix gently and cook on a medium flame for 2 minutes, while stirring occasionally.
- 2. Serve hot garnished with coriander.





Banana Pancakes with Chocolate Sauce

Melt-in-your-mouth pancakes made with a batter of mashed bananas and whole wheat flour, and drizzled with chocolate sauce, taste out of the world. Indeed, this is a dessert you will want to have again in the morning for breakfast too - and no harm in that because it is quick, easy, healthy and memorably tasty as well!

Preparation Time: 5 mins Cooking Time: 7 mins

INGREDIENTS

For The Pancakes

1/4 cup mashed banana

1/2 cup whole wheat flour (gehun ka atta)

1 tsp butter for greasing and cooking

For The Chocolate Sauce

1/2 cup roughly chopped chocolate

1/4 cup milk

METHOD

For the pancakes

- 1. Combine all the ingredients along with 1 cup of water in a deep bowl and mix well.
- 2. Heat a non-stick tava (griddle), pour $\frac{1}{4}$ cup of the batter on it and spread in a circular motion to make a thick pancake of 100 mm. (4") diameter.
- 3. Cook the pancake on a medium flame, using a little butter, till it turns golden brown in colour from both the sides.
- 4. Repeat steps 2 and 3 to make about 4 more pancakes. Keep aside.

For the chocolate sauce

- 1. Combine the chocolate and milk in a microwave-safe bowl and microwave on high for 30 seconds.
- 2. Remove and mix gently. Keep aside.

HOW TO PROCEED

- 1. Place each pancake on a serving plate, fold into a triangle.
- 2. Pour little chocolate sauce over each pancake and serve immediately garnished with almond slivers.

Quick Rava and Vegetable Dhoklas

Preparation Time: 30 mins Cooking Time: 15 mins Makes 3 to 4 servings

Quick rava and vegetable dhoklas are delicious, healthy and easy to make too. You just need to plan half an hour ahead to ferment the quick-fix batter, and you are ready to go. With colourful veggies and a springy soft finish, children will love these dhoklas; and so will the others in your family!

INGREDIENTS

- 1 1/4 cups semolina (rava)
- 2 cups buttermilk
- 1/4 cup boiled mixed vegetables
- 2 tsp ginger-green chilli paste
- 1 1/2 tsp fruit salt
- 1 tbsp oil
- · Salt to taste
- · Oil for greasing

FOR THE TEMPERING

- 1 tsp mustard seeds (rai / sarson)
- 1 tsp sesame seeds (til)
- A pinch of asafoetida (hing)
- 1 tbsp oil

METHOD

- 1. Mix the semolina, buttermilk, vegetables, ginger-green chilli paste, oil and salt in a bowl to make a smooth batter. Keep aside for at least 30 minutes.
- 2. Add the fruit salt, mix well and pour the batter into a greased 200 mm. (8") diameter thali. Steam for 8 to 10 minutes.
- 3. Prepare the tempering by heating the oil, adding the mustard seeds, sesame seeds and asafoetida and frying until the seeds crackle. Pour the tempering over the prepared dhokla.
- 4. Cut into pieces and serve hot with green chutney.

TIPS

It is important to add the fruit salt just before you put the dhoklas to steam and to ensure the water is boiling when you put the dhoklas to steam.

VARIATION: QUICK VEGETABLES IDLIS

You can also steam the same batter to make idlis.



Vegetable and Bean Soup

Preparation Time: 10 mins Cooking Time: 20 mins Makes 4 servings

INGREDIENTS

- 2 cups finely chopped tomatoes
- 1 cup finely chopped onions
- 1/2 cup potato cubes
- 1/2 cup chopped cabbage
- 1/4 cup soaked and cooked rajma (kidney beans)
- 2 tbsp soaked and cooked barley (jau)
- · 2 tsp olive oil
- · Salt to taste
- Freshly ground black peppercorns (kali mirch) to taste

FOR THE GARNISH

• 2 tsp roasted wheat bran

METHOD

- Combine 1 cup of tomatoes, ½ cup of onions, potatoes, 3 cups of water and salt, mix well and pressure cook for 2 whistles.
- Allow the steam to escape before opening the lid.
- 3. Cool and blend in a mixer to a smooth purée. Keep aside.
- Heat the oil in a deep non-stick pan; add the remaining onions and sauté on a medium flame till they turn translucent.
- 5. Add the cabbage and sauté on a medium flame for another minute.
- Add the remaining 1 cup of tomatoes, rajma, barley, salt and pepper powder, mix well and cook on a medium flame for 1 to 2 minutes.
- 7. Add the tomato-onion mixture, mix well and bring to boil.
- 8. Serve hot garnished with roasted wheat bran.

An appetizing combination of fresh veggies and protein-rich beans cooked in olive oil, which contains a blood cholesterol-lowering substance called 'squalene'. Antioxidants like 'quercetin' and 'selenium' found in onions protect the heart from free radical damage.
